

- To protect your eyes from chemical splashes, you can wear either safety glasses OR safety goggles.

 - False** (Safety glasses provide protection from particles and only MINIMAL protection from liquids, since they do not seal tightly to your face. Wear safety goggles to protect your eyes from liquid splashes.)
- If you wear contact lenses you don't need to wear goggles to protect your eyes from chemical splashes.
 - ~~True~~
 - False** (Contact lenses are NOT a form of eye protection. When handling liquid chemicals that may splash into your eyes you must wear GOGGLES.)
- You are about to perform a task that will generate a large amount of flying particles. You must protect your eyes, as well as your face. You have a face shield without the Z87 imprint, and safety glasses. What should you do?
 - ~~Use only the face shield. It's only a short task.~~
 - ~~Wear only the safety glasses and stay as far back as you can.~~
 - Wear both safety glasses and the face shield.** (When the face shield does NOT have the Z87 imprint it means that it will not protect you from impact. Always wear safety glasses as well as a face shield to protect your eyes AND your face.)
 - ~~Borrow a pair of safety goggles from a co-worker.~~
- Fit and comfort are features that don't matter when purchasing safety glasses.
 - ~~True~~
 - False** (The fit and comfort if your safety glasses are critical. Take the time to select a model that fits YOU!)
- A welding helmet protects your eyes from all of the following EXCEPT:
